INSTRUCTOR INFO:

Autumn O'Hara specializes in training horses for the western discipline. Autumn team ropes, barrel races, and rodeos, and is a member of the National Team Roping League. She has won numerous awards and prizes. In addition, Autumn has a Masters degree in Occupational Therapy, which helps her to understand the kinetic relationship between horse and rider. Autumn's undergraduate degree is in health and physical education - teaching is her passion. Helping people to understand how to get the most from their horses while having fun is what Autumn does best. She was a Tri State Riding Club instructor for a number of years. Autumn is a licensed and certified occupational therapist and certified therapeutic riding instructor and is the Executive Director, Ride-on Ranch.

Charli Grefenstette is a true Virginia horse woman. Born and raised in Loudoun County, she has trained and competed in disciplines ranging from Hunter Jumper to Rodeo. Her true passion lies in the Western lifestyle. After earning a degree in Biology from the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Charli held the title of Miss Rodeo Virginia, where she traveled the country promoting her home state of Virginia and the sport of rodeo. Charli attended over 50 rodeos throughout the country where she rode various horses at various skill levels carrying the American flag. After her tenure as Miss Rodeo Virginia, Charli moved to Texas and Colorado to pursue a career in horses and rodeo. Utilizing her public relations skills, she became the official sideline reporter for the Professional Cowboys Rodeo Association, attending the top rodeos in the country conducting interviews of cowboys and cowgirls for national television. Since returning to Virginia in 2013, Charli trains horses and is the Director, Operations of Ride-On Ranch, a family-run Equine Assisted Therapy program in Lovettsville, VA. In addition, Charli is the TSRC western lesson instructor.
